

## Definition for the different categories

Members of the Bar - Admitted as an Advocate & Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya and possess a valid practising certificate and be attached to firm and in active practise or pending issuance of a practising certificate (need to provide proof of application)

Members of the Bar (3 years and below) - Admitted as an Advocate & Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya less than 3 years ago and possess a valid practising certificate and be attached to firm and in active practise or pending issuance of a practising certificate (need to provide proof of application)

Pupils-in-Chambers and Law Students - Pupils undergoing their pupillage or completed their pupillage and pending hearing of their Petition for Admission as an Advocate & Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya

- Law undergraduates (must provide valid student card or enrolment letter from university/college)

- Law graduates pending CLP (within one year from date conferred with LL.B) (need to provide letter of confirmation from Law College to confirm enrolment for the CLP intake)

Non-members - No legal qualifications

- With legal qualifications but were never admitted as an Advocate & Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya

- Admitted as an Advocate & Solicitor of the High Court of Malaya but do not possess a valid practising certificate i.e. not in practice

- Possess a valid practising certificate but not in active practice and not attached to a firm

- Students pursuing their Masters or PhD and non-Law related degrees
