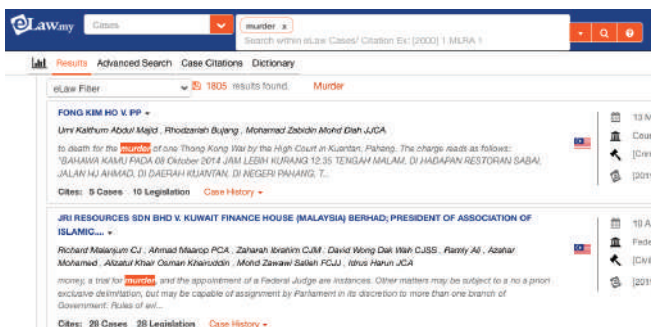
2. Cases

Smart Case Search

Selecting **Cases** will bring you to the following:

eLaw Search Box allows you to:

- 2.1) Key in a word and press Enter or Search. Eg Murder. Upon viewing the results, Murder will appear in a bordered Search Text.



- 2.2) Type in as many Search Texts as you want. So, you can keep refining your search to get your desired results.



- 2.3) Edit any Search Text. Just type on any word to edit the search.



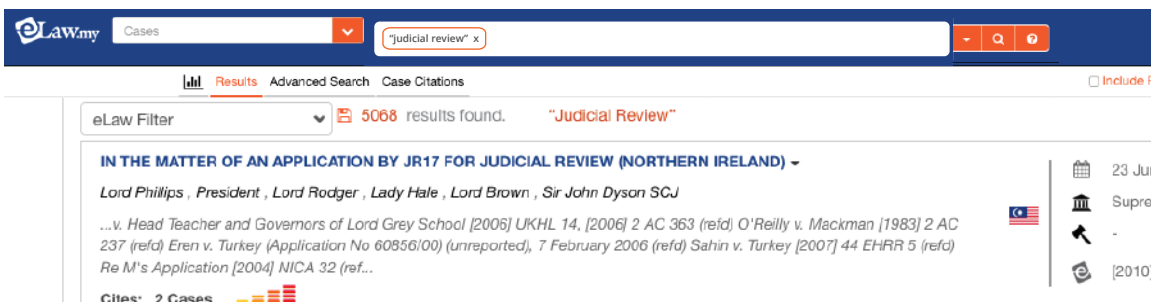
- 2.4) Remove a search text by clicking x



- 2.5) View the search parameters and criteria to keep track of your search options.



- 2.6) By default, just typing out a search phrase eg Judicial Review, will give you results of the exact phrase first. Alternatively, users may use quotation marks "eg. "Judicial Review".



2.7) Search by using + and - to refine results. eg. murder + gun - knife will give the results for cases with the words murder and gun in them, but will not include results with the word knife.



★ 2.8) Search using Citation

There are 2 ways to search by citation

Option a) Type directly into the Search Box in either of the following formats:

- (i) Journal Year Volume Page eg MLRA 2016 4 538
- (ii) [Year] Volume Journal Page eg [2016] 4 MLRA 538



Option b) Click on Case Citations

- a) You can choose the citation from our following reported journals:
 - **MLRA** – Malaysian Law Review Appellate Court (Cases from Court of Appeal and Federal Court)
 - **MLRH** - Malaysian Law Review High Court (Cases from the High Court)
 - **MELR** - Malaysian Employment Law Review
(Cases from the Industrial Court and employment-related cases from the superior courts)
 - **SSLR** – Sabah Sarawak Law Review (Cases from the High Court of Sabah and Sarawak)
 - **Others** – Key in citations from other local publishers. eLaw will extract The Legal Review’s version of the judgment that corresponds to the keyed in citation.
- b) Key in Year of the citation (if any)
- c) Key in Volume of the citation (if any)
- d) Key in Page of the citation (if any)

★2.9) Advanced Search: This allows users to further refine their research based on specific criteria such as Judge Name, Legislation Referred and Judgment Year.

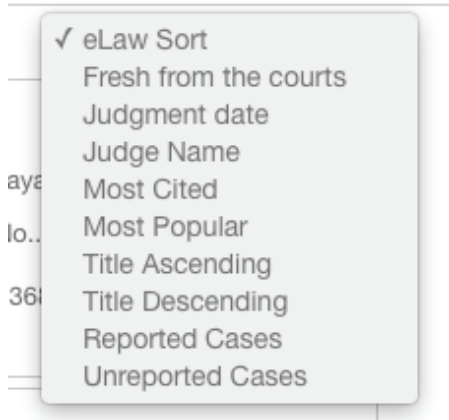

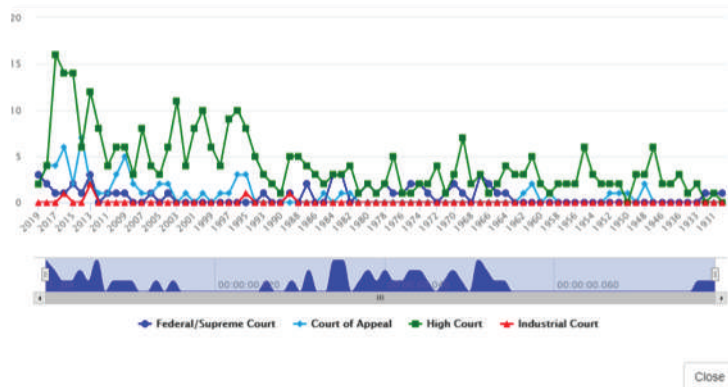
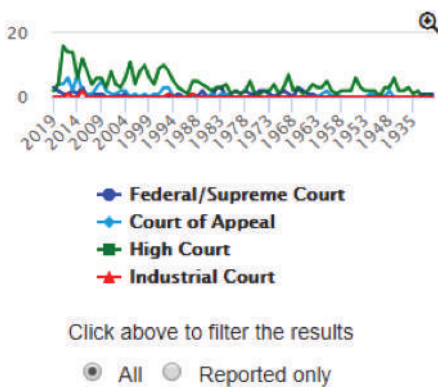
4 eLaw Sort: The cases can be sorted based on the following criteria:



- ★ ✓ **Fresh from the courts:** Some judgments may be dated sometime ago (eg 6 months ago) but has just been released for dissemination by the courts.
- ✓ **Judge name:** Results will appear with judges names' sorted alphabetically A-Z.
- ★ ✓ **Most cited:** Sort by cases that have been most referred by other cases.
- ★ ✓ **Most popular:** Sort by cases that have been most often read by eLaw users
- ✓ **Title Ascending/Descending:** Sort by Judgment Title alphabetically.
- ✓ **Reported/Unreported cases:** Sort by Reported/Unreported cases appearing first.

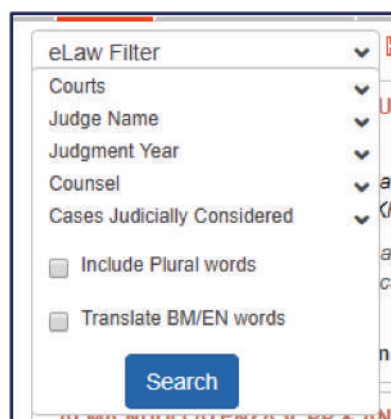
★ 5 Analytics Diagram: This interactive diagram illustrates the number of cases from the various courts through the years.

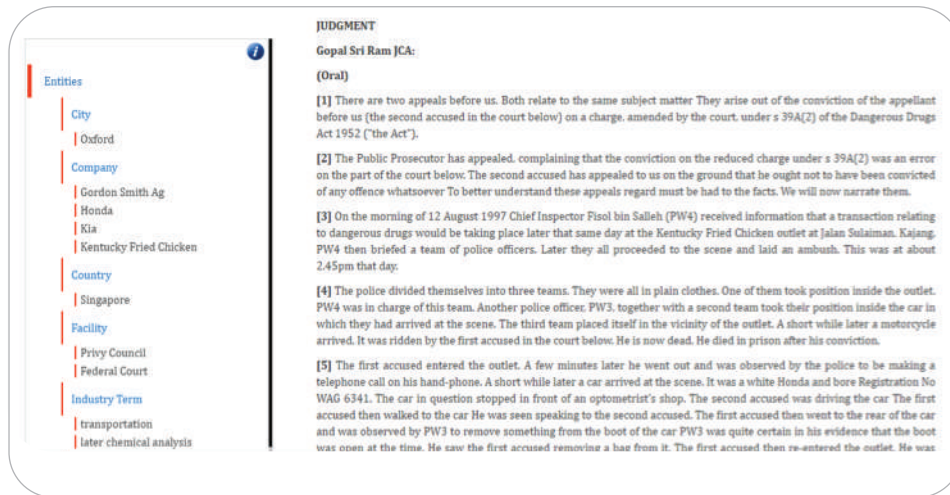

4 Case Attributes: This function is to show the summary information's regarding the entities, person, organization, country and etc that involved in this case.

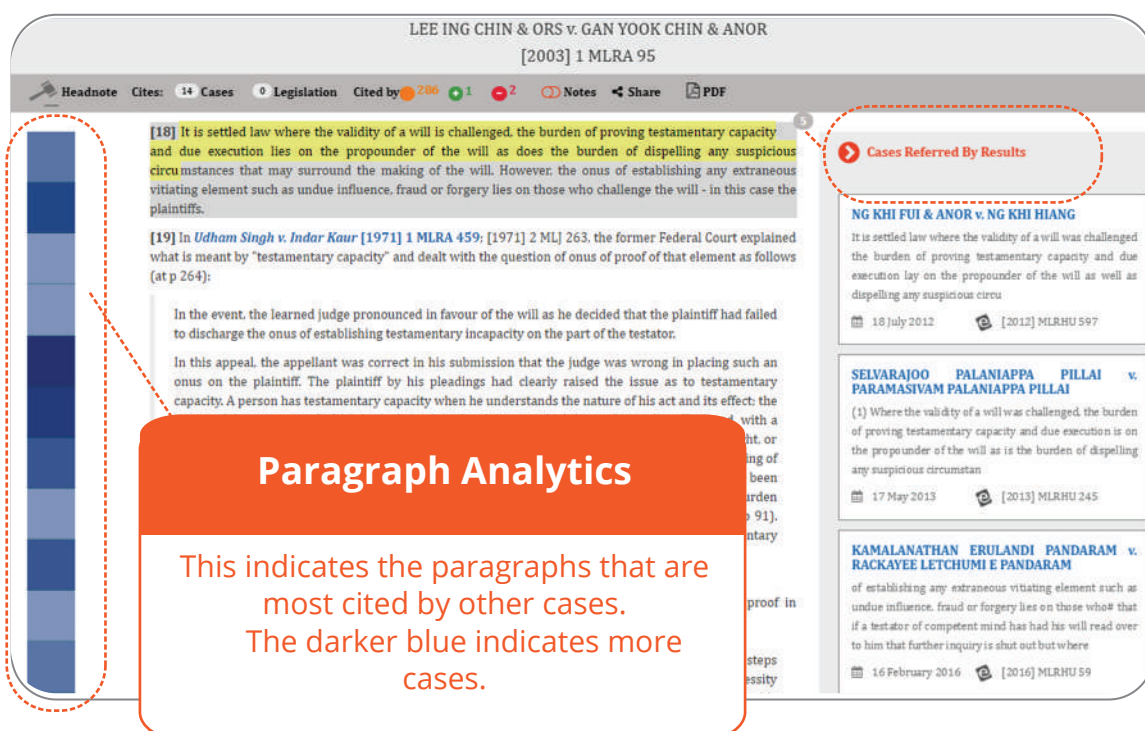


5 Share via Social Media: The case can be shared via various social media apps

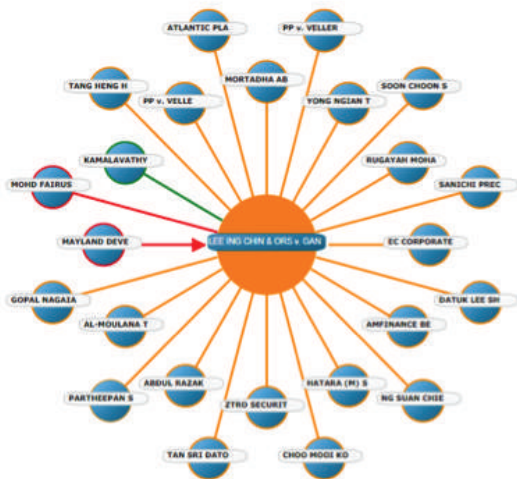

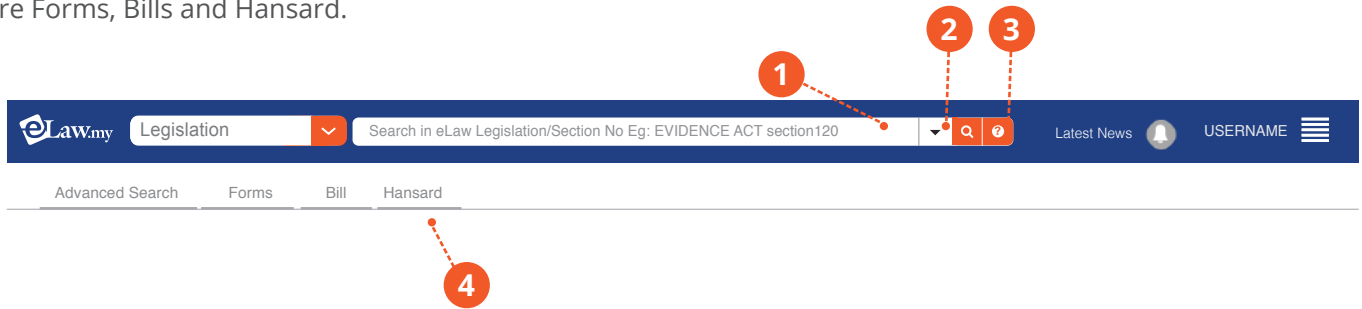

Legislation Search

eLaw has the most updated and complete federal and state legislation database in Malaysia. Also included are Forms, Bills and Hansard.



1 Search Box: Key in keywords in either Bahasa Malaysia or English. We have legislation in both languages. eg Evidence Act s120, or Evidence Act section 20, or Evidence Act s. 20.

2 Advanced Search



- a Act Title: This is a dropdown list of all acts alphabetically.
- b Act No: Key in the act number. This usually applies for federal statutes.
- c Section Title: A dropdown list of all sections of the selected act will appear for selection.
- d Federal/State: Zoom in on only federal statutes or legislation from a particular state.
- e Without the word(s): Exclude certain words from your results.

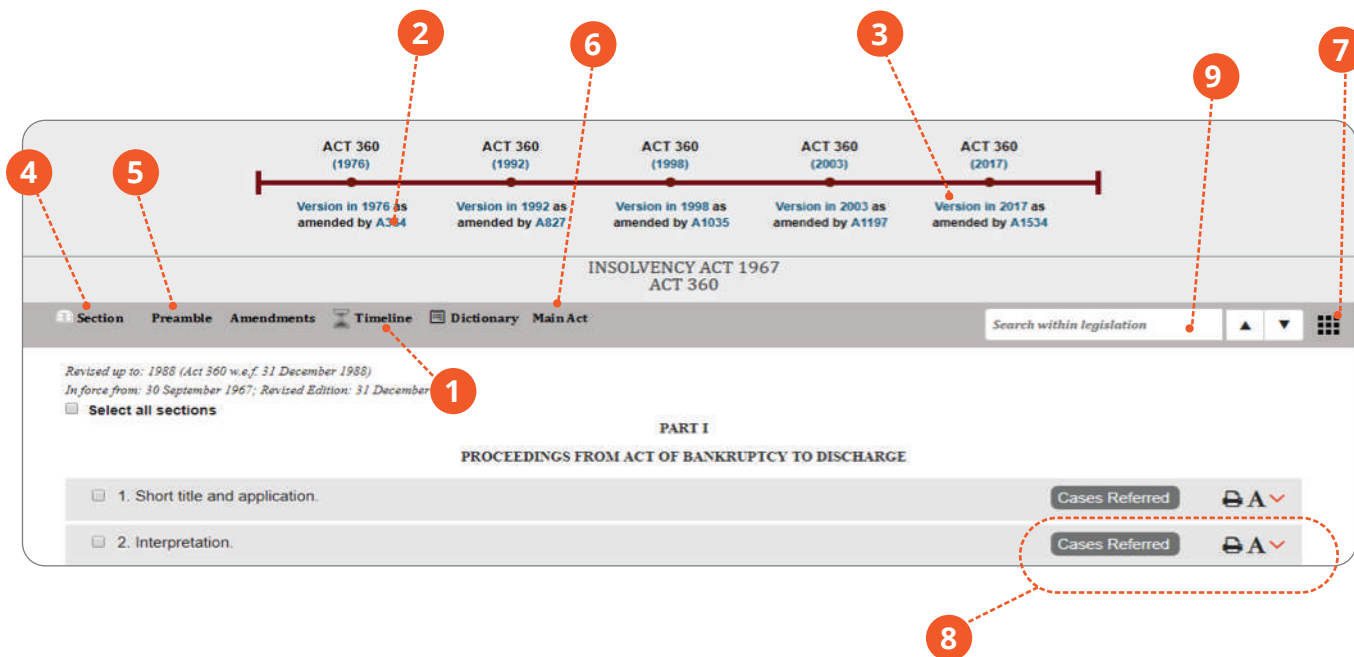

- 1 Timeline: The timeline format allows users to scroll through the amendments in a graphical form.
- 2 Amended by: This will show users the amendment to that legislation.
- 3 Version: Users will be able to view the version of the legislation document at a particular time
- 4 Section: Specific sections of the acts can be selected here.
- 5 Preamble: The purpose, objective and justification of the act is detailed here.
- 6 Main Act: Click this if you are at an amending act or an amendment and wish to view the main act it refers to.
- 7 Tools Menu: Save the legislation and increase font size here.
- 8 Cases Referred: The cases that refer to a specific section can be listed. Users can then begin and drill down their research by limiting their research to cases referring to a specific section of an act.
- 9 Search using keywords: Search for words within a legislation.

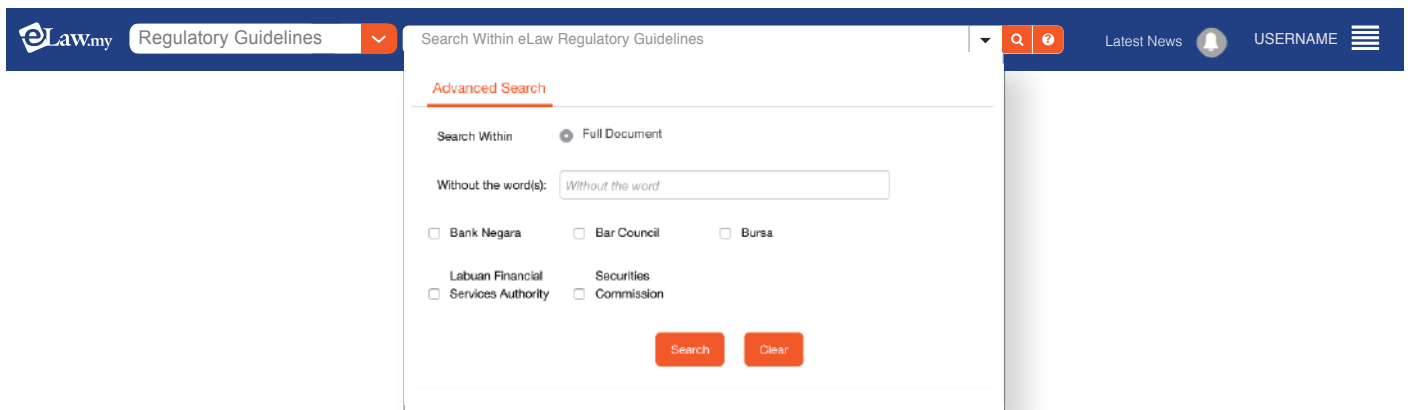
